Welcome to the Marian University Theatre! We are excited to find this new theatre home on the grounds of a very beautiful and historic (est. 1851) university, blessed into existence through the prayers and diligence of its founding patrons.

In 2017, the Ballet Theatre of Carmel (at the time, Ballet Theatre of Carmel at Performer's Edge) premiered its rendition of the classic full-length ballet *Cinderella*. Our 2017 Cinderellas have just graduated from college and are about to venture into their respective futures. Miss Lacey Marsh has received a degree in Marketing and Digital Business Applications from the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University, and just completed an internship with the 500 Festival for this year's Indy 500. She will be working as a graphic designer at a creative agency in Indianapolis. Miss Erica Lohman received her Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Dance Performance and Choreography from the University of Missouri Kansas City Conservatory Dance Division. She will become a company member of DE LA Dance Company in Cincinnati, Ohio.

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THE STORY OF CINDERELLA

Cinderella, the daughter of a country gentleman, lost her mother when she was still quite young. Her good-hearted father married again, and soon after, he also died, leaving her in the care of her stepmother and two stepsisters. These self-absorbed women neglect and abuse Cinderella whom they treat as a scullery maid. All day long Cinderella is made to sweep, clean and polish...

ACT ONE

Cinderella's House

Cinderella's Stepmother and Stepsisters are terribly excited! They have been invited to a ball at the palace during which the Prince will choose his bride! Poor Cinderella however, has been forbidden to attend by her Stepmother, despite the fact that she too, is eligible.

People come and go all day, preparing the Stepsisters for the important event. First is the hairdresser, then the dressmaker and her assistants, and finally the dance teacher and her violinist. Cinderella receives none of this attention and wistfully recalls the happier days when her mother was still alive. She finds comfort in her special song bird and mice friends.

In the midst of this hectic day, an old beggar woman comes asking for alms. The Stepmother and Stepsisters are unnerved by this woman and avoid her, but Cinderella offers her a warm place by the fire and something to eat and drink. The old woman casts a gentle look at the kind girl, asks about her mother's photo on the fireplace mantle, then offers a mysterious blessing and disappears.

Her Stepmother and Stepsisters depart for the ball in a frantic swirl of dresses, perfume, and jewels. Cinderella is once again alone and is overcome by the sadness of her life.

The Garden

Suddenly, the beggar woman reappears and reveals herself as Cinderella's Fairy Godmother! She leads Cinderella to the back garden which has transformed into a beautiful enchanted realm. There, the fairies of the four seasons offer her encouragement and magical gifts. The Fairy Godmother tells Cinderella that, as a reward for her kindness and daily perseverance, she shall go to the ball in the most beautiful dress of all, accompanied by her own footman, in a magical carriage of her own. Cinderella is delighted beyond words!

The Midnight Fairy and her attendants appear to warn Cinderella that she must leave the ball before the clock strikes midnight. For at midnight, all the magic will fade away and Cinderella will be dressed in her rags once more.

Cinderella watches in awe as the pumpkin she grew in her little kitchen garden is instantly transformed into a luxurious carriage pulled by pure white horses. Dressed in shimmering white, with magical glass slippers on her feet, and attended by a handsome footman, Cinderella rides away to the ball.



ACT TWO

The Ball

The Prince's Lieutenant announces that the ball is about to begin. The guests arrive from across the kingdom and around the world, including Cinderella's Stepmother and Stepsisters. The royal guests find these new arrivals beautiful albeit somewhat eccentric.

After much anticipation and amidst great fanfare, the Prince arrives at the ball. The Prince kindly indulges the antics of the Stepmother and Stepsisters, then encourages his Lieutenant and two gentlemen friends to entertain them. As the ladies are lovely—despite their oddities—the gentlemen are willing companions to them.

The ballroom is suddenly bathed in a soft glowing light as the Fairy Godmother and her magical attendants appear heralding Cinderella's entrance. She is escorted by her Fairy Godmother who, with her magical powers, briefly arrests the passage of time to ensure Cinderella and the Prince are able to meet uninterrupted.

The Prince falls immediately in love with Cinderella and she with him and, as time resumes, the entire court is spellbound by the beauty and quiet charm of Cinderella. An unforgettable evening transpires for Cinderella as she realizes that the Prince is just as deeply in love with her as she is with him.

The festivities are at their height when the clock strikes midnight and the Midnight Fairy and her attendants hurry Cinderella away. Cinderella rushes from the palace, losing one of her glass slippers on the stairs. Dismayed, the Prince picks up the slipper and vows to find, and marry, the girl who wore the shoe.

ACT THREE

After the Ball

The Prince and his Lieutenant set off immediately to find the mysterious girl with the glass slipper. They plan to start with the ball guests from the kingdom, and travel onwards to neighboring countries and then far-off empires in Spain and the Middle East if necessary.

One morning, Cinderella once again stands by the kitchen fireside. Was it all a dream, she wonders? Reaching into her apron pocket, her fingers brush against the elegant glass slipper. No, it wasn't! The slipper was proof of the magical night and of her Prince.

Meanwhile, the Stepmother and Stepsisters awaken and talk of nothing but the ball. They are especially pleased with the fact that the mysterious young woman gifted her highly valued oranges to them. They soon learn that a proclamation has been made by the King decreeing that all eligible ladies are to have a shoe fitting to find the Prince's bride-to-be.

The Prince and his Lieutenant soon arrive with pomp and pageantry. It is the household's turn for the royal shoe fitting. Both of the Stepsisters attempt to squeeze their feet into the tiny slipper but it is obvious that the shoe belongs to neither of them. Meanwhile, Cinderella remains hidden-curious, but ashamed of her ragged appearance. Even the Stepmother insists on trying the shoe, claiming that she will cut her toes off with large shears to make them fit! Finally when Cinderella can stay quiet no longer, she bursts into the room to stop the madness and the other glass slipper accidentally drops from her pocket!

The Prince immediately recognizes the modest Cinderella as the beautiful girl from the ball. Realizing her identity, and that she will soon be a Princess, the Stepmother and Stepsisters reflect on their many misdeeds and ask for forgiveness from the kind and gentle Cinderella, which she of course grants. The Fairy Godmother reappears to bless the union of Cinderella and the Prince who leave immediately to prepare for their grand wedding.

The Wedding

Guests, including all of Cinderella's newly reconciled stepfamily (and their royal fiancés!), joyously make their way to the palace and into the Grand Ballroom. The celebration is the grandest to have ever been held in the land, and all of the magical fairies join the mortals in a Grand Waltz to celebrate the kingdom's new Princess and her Prince!

Historical Notes

- *Cinderella*, with choreography by Rostislav Zakharov, was given its world premiere by the Bolshoi Ballet on November 21, 1945 with Olga Lepeshinskaya as Cinderella and Vladimir Preobrazhensky as the Prince.
- *Cinderella*, with choreography by Konstantin Sergeyev, was first performed by the Kirov Ballet on April 8, 1946 with Natalia Dudinskaya as Cinderella and Konstantin Sergeyev as the Prince.
- Frederick Ashton's famous *Cinderella* was given its world premiere by the Sadler's Wells Ballet at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden, London on December 23, 1948, danced by Moira Shearer (Cinderella), Michael Somes (Prince), Frederick Ashton and Robert Helpman (Stepsisters), and Alexander Grant (The Jester).

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




