

Message from the Artistic Directors

Greetings,

As you take your seats tonight, we wish to transport you to another time and another place, for that is, afterall, what an enchanted tale is all about!

The time is 1909, the place is the Théâtre du Châtelet in Paris, France. The world of ballet is changing dramatically, with Sergei Diaghilev's Ballets Russes influencing not only ballet but also theatre, fashion, visual arts, and interior design. With groundbreaking choreographic originality and an innovative use of collaborating artists (including composers Igor Stravinsky and Claude Debussey, choreographers Michel Fokine and George Balanchine, painters Henri Matisse and Pablo Picasso, and dancers Vaslav Nijinsky and Anna Pavlova) they produced some of the most significant ballet masterpieces of the twentieth century.

Over 100 years later, many of these spectacles are still performed by ballet companies large and small. Ballet Theatre of Carmel Academy is excited to be celebrating these icons of the ballet world and the Golden Age of Ballet with ENCHANTED TALES!

As the curtain goes up, we invite you to get caught up in the pure beauty of Les Sylphides. A tribute to the Romantic Era of the 1830's and 40's, it is set to the timeless music of Frédéric Chopin and choreographed by the gifted Michel Fokine. As they pay homage to the ballets of days gone by, we in turn honor their beautiful creation.

The middle section of our triple bill opens on a whimsical pastoral scene

reminiscent of a Claude Monet painting. Here, we celebrate legendary ballerina Anna Pavlova. Known around the globe as the shining star of Sergei Diaghilev's Ballets Russes, Pavlova charmed audiences with her beauty, charisma, and other-worldly movement style. Our younger dancers present a lively new work—Search for a Dragonfly; followed by three of Pavlova's iconic solos—the joyous Dragonfly, the Persian celestial being La Peri, and the heart-wrenching Dying Swan, each interpreted with nuance and assurance by our talented upper level students.

Act Three's *The Firebird* is—in stark contrast to *Les Sylphides*—a highly stylized and evocative ballet based on several fairy tales combined into one dramatic and magical story. It is set to a complex score by Igor Stravinsky, and the choreographer is once again Michel Fokine, which speaks to this master's immense talent and range of expressivity.

In a nod to the early influence of ballet on fashion, we are thrilled to bring some of our most treasured vintage costumes to this unique production! Pieces from our Lowder Collection, inherited from our founding director Nataly Lowder,

bring a unique color palette and style to the Anna Paylova tribute. We are also delighted to have four original Karinska costumes make an appearance in The Firebird's wedding scene. Barbara Karinska was an Oscar winning costume designer working in film, theatre, and ballet in the 1940's-70's. Her ballet costuming was showcased in the repertory of The Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo (the second iteration of the Ballets Russes) and then for what would become the New York City Ballet under George Balanchine. Karinska's original creations are rare collector's items to this day, and we love to bathe these treasures under the stage lights from time to time!

And finally, we are excited to have this opportunity to welcome five very talented Guest Artists to our Enchanted Tales stage! Erica Lohman and Emmanuelle Hendrickson both received their formative training with Ballet Theatre of Carmel Academy and are now dancing with professional ballet companies—American Midwest Ballet and Colorado Ballet Studio Company respectively. We are tremendously proud of their achievements, and appreciate their willingness to share their perspectives and insights into the professional ballet world with our academy students as part of their ongoing dance education. Aram Hengan and Gabriel Weiner are students of the esteemed Indiana University Jacobs School of Music Ballet Department (one of the top US collegiate ballet programs), and danced in their 2024 world premiers of Sasha Janes' The Nutcracker, and Phil Chan & Doug Fullington's A Star on

the Rise: La Bayadere Reimagined! Mr. James Cramer, formerly of Indianapolis Ballet Theatre, once again brings his vast experience in character and mime roles to help us tell our story. It's been wonderful having these gentlemen in rehearsals serving as mentors to the dancers in our burgeoning Boys Ballet program.

We thank you for joining us and sharing in this celebration of ballet past, present and future! Enjoy *Enchanted Tales*!

The sylphs delight and charm the poet, entrancing him, but he finds himself unable to touch or catch them. Are they real, or is it a dream? Only the sylphides know for sure....

ACT 2—ANNA PAVLOVA TRIBUTE

A Day in Provence—Search for a Dragonfly

It is a beautiful day in the Provence region of France and a group of young village boys are on a search for the elusive Dragonfly in a flower garden filled with Water Lilies, Daisies, and Poppies.

The Dragonfly

A lively dragonfly frolics through a garden on gossamer wings

La Péri

A mythical Persian fairy, the Péri, holds the Flower of Immortality sought by Iskender to prolong his life.

Dying Swan

The last moments of a dying swan.

ACT 3—THE FIREBIRD

Late one afternoon Prince Ivan goes hunting and soon becomes lost deep in a mysterious forest. An exquisite Firebird appears and Ivan watches the mythical creature in her nightly ritual of eating apples from a Golden Apple Tree. He begins to chase her, for he is a hunter afterall, and eventually he succeeds in capturing her. The Firebird struggles to escape and begs for her freedom. In exchange for releasing her, the Firebird gives Prince Ivan a magical feather he can use to summon her in times of danger. The Firebird then disappears and Ivan is again alone in the forest... or so he thinks!

Ivan wanders through the forest until he stumbles upon a golden gate set into a stone wall, surrounding an old castle. The beautiful Princess Vasilisa and her sisters suddenly appear, and Ivan falls in love with her at first sight! He hides, and watches the Princess, her 5 sisters, and the fairies dance and frolic around the Golden Apple Tree. All of a sudden, the Princesses see Ivan and are afraid of the stranger. Princess Vasilisa cautiously steps forward and Prince Ivan learns that he has trespassed into the garden of the evil sorcerer Kaschei the Deathless! The princesses are his prisoners, controlled by his magical power. Kaschei has turned everyone in the kingdom to stone, and though the Princesses are allowed to play outside at night, they are turned back into stone every day.

Prince Ivan and Princess Vasilisa dance tenderly together but are soon interrupted by the sounds of someone or something—approaching. Princess Vasilisa warns Ivan to flee, and the Princesses rush away. But despite Vasilisa's warning, Ivan follows them towards the castle. When he reaches the gate Kaschei's bodyguards rush out and capture Ivan! Kaschei appears, along with his daughters and an entourage of bodyguards, henchmen, sorceresses, apprentices, and minions. He wields his magical staff and flings Ivan around the garden in a struggle to the death. Just as it seems certain Kaschei will prevail, Prince Ivan remembers the magic feather tucked into his jacket, and pulls it out to summon the Firebird!

In all her glorious splendor, the Firebird appears and with her own magic, she propels Kaschei and all his supporters into the wild and infectious Infernal

Dance, until they collapse from exhaustion. The Firebird directs Prince Ivan to a chest and within it the large golden egg that holds Kaschei's power and his very soul. Ivan holds it aloft, then brings it shattering to the ground, killing Kaschei, his daughters, and all of the evil beings, and breaking the spell to free the Princesses and the kingdom! Prince Ivan and Princess Vasilisa are married in a glorious ceremony. The Firebird, and the entire kingdom celebrate their freedom, and they all live happily ever after!



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In Memoriam

As we open for our 15th Spring Ballet we wish to remember two of our greatest mentors, advocates, and benefactors, Karl Kaufman and Ron Morgan, whom we sadly lost this year. We stand on the shoulders of these two great influencers of the arts.

Karl Kaufman was a Butler University Professor and founding Director of Indianapolis Ballet Theatre (later renamed Ballet Internationle). He was also instrumental in shaping the history of Lexington Ballet Company (KY). Karl was not only known as a great coach and instructor, but also for his artistic talents in the area of stage sets and backdrops. BTCA's Artistic Directors Frank and Jane Weiner were honored to be gifted his inventory of stunning hand-painted backdrops when Karl moved from Central Indiana. Karl always used to say, "Backdrops and costumes need to be bathed in stage lights. They are not meant to sit folded and stored in dark lonely rooms." We promised him that they would be put on stage to adorn many ballets and we have been true to our word.

Ron Morgan needs very little introduction here in Indianapolis and Carmel. After graduating from Butler University, Ron had a brilliant career on Broadway before returning home. He staged multiple productions for Civic Theater, Beef and Boards and others. In tandem, he founded Performer's Edge Dance Theatre to educate future generations of musical theatre performers. When the school began offering classical ballet, Ron incorporated Ballet Theatre of Carmel as a non-profit focused on providing pre-professional ballet training and performance. Nataly Lowder was the





founding Artistic Director, Jane Hachiya-Weiner the Ballet Mistress, and Frank Weiner, the Technical Director.

Even during his most busy times of staging shows and coaching and adjudicating musical theatre groups, Ron remained a stalwart supporter of our beloved Ballet Theatre of Carmel. His generous donation of studio assets including sprung floors, marley flooring, and barres was instrumental in making the transition to our own independent Ballet Theatre of Carmel Academy in 2018 a smooth and successful one.

May Karl and Ron both look down on us from above and know that we are forever grateful, and will remember and honor them always.
